SD1 Volunteer Storm Drain Marking Program

- Our curbside storm drains can be a major channel for pollution.
- Many people dump oil, paint, trash and other pollutants into these storm drains, unaware that they empty directly into nearby waterways.
- After heavy rains, storm water runs through streets and parking lots into storm drains. Along the way, this water picks up leaves, debris, litter and anything else that might be on the ground. These various substances clog pipes which cause the streets to flood.
- Storm water also collects excess pesticides, fertilizers, pet waste and other substances which can be harmful to aquatic life and residents who recreate in local waters.
- Storm water carries pollution to the nearest body of water or the nearest storm drain.
- Northern Kentucky has over 25,000 storm drains.
- By participating in SD1's Storm Drain Marking Program, you are helping protect the environment while educating community members about storm water pollution.
