IN THE KITCHEN

Dispose of fats, oils and grease (FOG) in the trash, not the drain.



Discard liquid FOG into a jar or container with a lid and dispose of it in the trash.



Wipe greasy pots, pans and dishes with paper towels before washing.

Keep these FOG foods out of the drain:

- Bacon grease
- Butter
- Cooking oils
- Dairy
- Dressing
- Gravy
- Lard
- Mayonnaise
- Peanut butter

IN THE BATHROOM

Flush only bodily waste, toilet paper and wastewater.



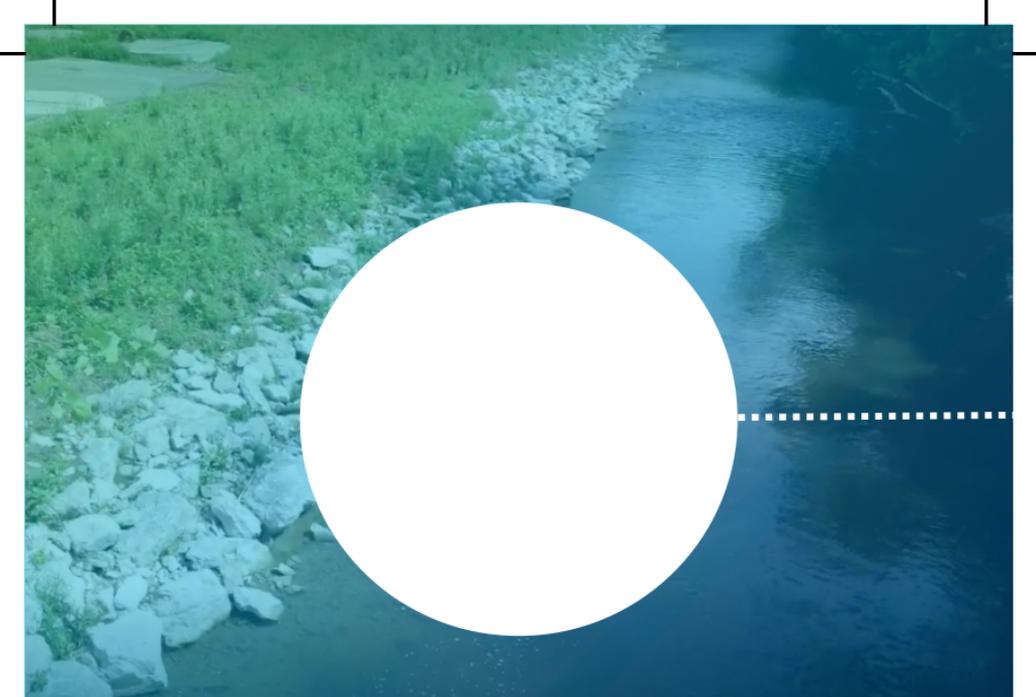
Place a trash bin in your bathrooms for easy trash collection.



Dispose of old medications or drugs at an approved drug take-back site or event.

Never flush:

- Cleansing wipes
- Cotton balls
- Cotton swabs
- Diapers
- Floss
- Pads
- Paper towels
- Tampons
- Tissues

WHY IT MATTERS:

Putting the wrong things down the drain can clog pipes, slow drainage and result in hazardous sewer backups and overflows.

Fixing these problems can be costly and disruptive for property owners and SD1.
